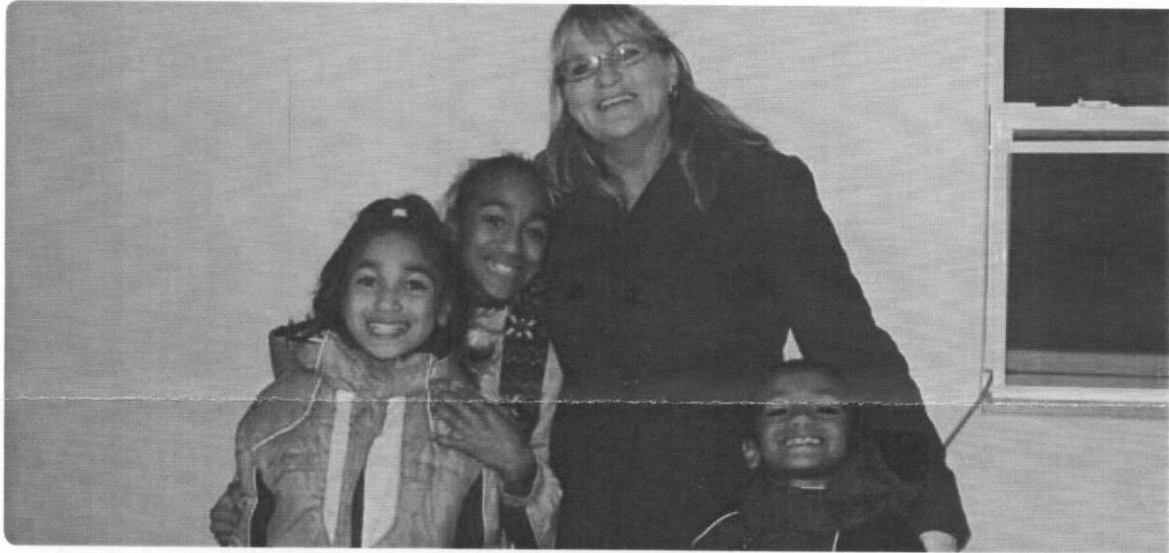

Years ago, Jacqueline Jackson lived for a time in public housing. The low income housing development, Homer's Villa, was part of Clearwater's Community Housing. But it had inherent problems, not the least of which was its inability to be self-sustaining. Now Jacqueline has the unique opportunity to be the first of 51 homeowners in Stevens Creek, the Habitat Pinellas subdivision being developed on the previous Homer's Villa site.

A mother of seven (only three of whom are still at home), Jacqueline considers her children a blessing. "They are very active and keep me young!" This family of four has been living in a cramped two bedroom apartment with no yard and little space for privacy. "We want a place to call our own and neighbors that respect one another."

When Jacqueline first found out she was accepted into the Habitat Program, her initial reaction was one of disbelief. "I thought, is this really happening? Could it be possible for my dream to come true? I have prayed for this for such a long time and God has answered my prayers through Habitat for Humanity." And then, after completing her first 100 sweat equity hours, she was presented a property in a location she knew all too well. But only the location remained the same...this wasn't a return to public housing...this was for a house she would own in a Habitat Pinellas community!

In a lot of ways, this is a rebirth; for the property and for Jacqueline and her children. "With our Habitat home, our world will never be the same," says Jacqueline. "To live in a secure, well-built house created from the loving hands of all the volunteers, WOW! What a bright future we will have."

Welcome Back, Jacqueline. There really is no place like home.
